

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School News:

Careers – Engineering with Atkins Realis

We had a visit from Rob Griffiths who works for Engineering firm, Atkins Realis. He spoke to the Year 11 pupils about his job and career in engineering. In particular, he spoke about his role in building one of the stadiums that was used in the last FIFA World Cup and how he was in charge of designing every aspect of the stadium and the very fine detail



needed. A picture of the impressive stadium is shown on the right.



He also spoke about how to become an engineer and the different career paths that could be taken to get into the industry. This was a really interesting talk which engaged the pupils completely. The number of questions that the pupils asked showed how engaged they were with the talk.

Cardiff Schools Basketball Tournament

This week Willows High entered teams in the Cardiff Schools Basketball Tournament for the first time ever. Pupils in year 10 and 11 took part in the event which was held at Cardiff University. Basketball is not a traditional sport for the school, so it is really nice that we now have



sufficient interest in the sport to be able to compete against other schools.



On Monday, it was the turn of Year 11. Despite our lack of experience, the boys did really well and gave a good account of themselves narrowly losing the first two games by 3 points. With very little playing experience of a full-size court, the boys can be proud of their efforts.

On Thursday, it was the turn of Year 10. The format was slightly different for this year group as they were all put into groups of 3 teams, with each of the 4 group winners going into a semi-final.

Our first game was against Radyr. The boys played really well and



ended up winning the game 16 points to 4. In game 2, we played a strong Cardiff West team who themselves had won their first game. Willows were



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again victorious, winning 16-4, the same score as game one. That meant we finished as group winners, winning 2 games out of 2, qualifying for the semi-final in our first ever tournament.

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In the semi-final, despite playing well and giving 100%, we lost to a strong Cathays team, who went into the final.

Overall, the boys can be really proud of themselves – 3 games played, 2 wins, 40 points scored, group winners – all in their first ever tournament. Special mention to all the players, but especially Joseph Adimike and Hamze Egeh, who were tremendous throughout the event.

We were delighted to welcome two of the stars of BBC's 'Casualty' to Willows on Wednesday. Kirstie Mitchell who plays nurse, Faith Cadogan and Neet Mohan who plays Dr. Rash Masum discussed their acting careers and role in the industry. We heard all about the scripting, acting and medical revision needed to work on the set that we toured earlier this term.

We were joined by series producer, Matt McHale who provided

insights into the writing, construction and production of television shows. His knowledge and experience of a wide variety of television programmes excited the Year 10's who are thinking of careers in this area.

Later Leanne and Deborah from BBC Studios gave us feedback on our own scripts from the 'Casualty' storyliners. We looked at further roles behind the camera and we were allowed to play with props that had been specially made for specific episodes.

Genius Hour – 8 Inness

For our Genius Hour project, the pupils in 8IN have been researching and trying to raise awareness of local charity CCAWS .

CCAWS was established in 2018, built on the work of its predecessor project Minds at Ease which provided culturally sensitive mental health support in South Wales from 2009-2015.

CCAWS is a community-led service, run for and by people from diverse communities. All of their trustees are from diverse community backgrounds, and over half of their

staff and volunteers also come from diverse communities. Their workforce truly represents the communities they serve, with an array of languages enabling them to deliver multilingual and multicultural support in a culturally and faith-sensitive setting. As a community-led service, they have lived experience, awareness, and understanding of cultural sensitivities and complexities.

Their approach is unique and successful in bridging the gap and in dealing with the mental health taboos and stigmas that often exist in culturally diverse communities.





Reading is everything!

Did you know that there is a link between your child reading for pleasure and their GCSE success? At Willows, we take every pupil in KS3 to the school library once a fortnight to choose a new book. We STAR test the pupils every term to check on their reading levels – this should help them to choose books at the right level.

Your job as families?


- Check that your child has their book and is reading it every night!
- Ask questions about the book: about the plot or characters
- Listen to them read check the book isn't too easy or too hard for them
- Make sure they are in the good habit of reading regularly

Remember, there is international evidence to suggest that this will help your child not just in English, but in *all* of their exams.

Most importantly...

Don't let your child take his/her phone to bed – take a book instead!

School Year Changes Consultation

The Welsh Government had opened a consultation to get views on a number of specific modifications (or changes) to the school calendar. They are proposing working with relevant bodies to reframe the traditional



parameters of the school calendar to create more consistent term-lengths and increase some half-term breaks so that each half-term is broadly the same length. Specific consultation questions are set out by following the link below.

The total number of days provided for learning, breaks, and staff training will not change. The Welsh Government will maintain the existing provision of 190 days/380 sessions (38 weeks) of learning, 13 weeks of school breaks, and the existing number of staff training (INSET) days per school year. Similarly, all public holidays will remain.



TimesTable Rockstars


Single numeracy boost sessions are provided to all our KS3 students on a fortnightly basis to enrich their Mathematical Skills, specifically with a focus on times tables. Students will be accessing their TTRS accounts and improving their knowledge of the times tables

At home, students must log on to TTRS via their technological devices at home. There is also a phone app that they can download via Apple or Android, free of charge.

All the students have 5-10minutes daily tasks on there to help consolidate their times tables. It will also earn them coins to use for customising their own individual avatars. Likewise, as with MathsWatch, there will be a leaderboard and certificates to reward their efforts.

Question of the week Week 13 – Starting 11.12.23

The Wandering Cow

Mme Kennedy lives on a farm with her favourite cow, Mimi. One day, there is a lot of wind and the fence around Mimi's paddock blows down, so Mimi decides to go exploring. REAL

She leaves at 3:20 p.m. and walks toward the neighbouring farm. It takes her 35 minutes to get there. She visits with her

friend Maisie the pig for 18 minutes. Instead of going straight home, she wanders over to a pasture, which is a 26 minutes walk. Here she enjoys the delicious green grass and eats for 8 minutes.


At the time Mimi starts eating the grass, Mme Kennedy goes to milk Mimi and notices the broken fence and the missing cow. She hops on her horse, finds Mimi in the pasture, and leads Mimi back to her own paddock. From the time she notices that Mimi was missing, it takes Mme Kennedy 17 minutes to find Mimi and return home.




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
Day 2 - Tuesday 12.12.23

Distance - Time Graphs:

Distance-time graphs are graphs that show the distance travelled against time. A distance-time graph will show the distance (in metres, kilometres, miles etc.) on the vertical axis (v-axis) and the time (in seconds, minutes, hours etc.) on the horizontal axis (x-axis).

Straight lines on a distance-time graph represent **constant speeds**. To find the speed from a distance-time graph you will need to be able to find **the gradient** of the straight lines.

The steeper the gradient, the faster the object is travelling.




Day 3 - Wednesday 13.12.23

Tree Diagrams:

Probability tree diagrams are a way of organising the information of two or more probability events. Probability tree diagrams show all the possible outcomes of the events and can be used to solve probability questions.

For example:

A coin is flipped and a dice is rolled. What is the probability of getting a 'tail' and a '6'? $P(A \text{ and } B) = P(A) \times P(B)$

<u>Probability</u>	<u>Terms – Part 1:</u>			
<u>Probability</u>	The likelihood of an event happening. Probability is expressed on a scale from 0 to 1. Where an event cannot happen, its probability is 0 and where it is certain its probability is 1. The probability of scoring 1 with a fair dice is 1/6. The denominator of the fraction expresses the total number of equally likely outcomes. The numerator expresses the number of outcomes that represent a 'successful' occurrence.			
<u>Probability</u> <u>scale</u>	This is a scale between zero and 1, with zero representing the impossibility of an event and 1 representing the fact that the event must happen. The sum of all the probabilities for all the events in a sample space is 1, where the sample space is the set of all possible outcomes of a trial.

Outcome	The result of a statistical trial.
	<u>For example</u> , when a coin is tossed there are two possible outcomes 'head' or 'tail'; when a cubic die is cast there are six possible outcomes if there is a different score on each face. What is meant as the outcome is dependent on what the trial sets out to do, so for example when two normal six-faced dice are rolled if the desired outcomes are the total scores on the two dice then the only possible outcomes are the scores 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11 and 12.
<u>Event</u>	A possible outcome of a statistical trial. For example, 'heads' when a coin is tossed.
<u>Combined</u> event	A Combined or compound event is an event that includes several outcomes; for example, in selecting people at random for a survey a compound event could be 'girl with brown eves'.



Important Information for All Parents and Guardians

Please be aware that **Fixed Penalty Notices** are now being issued by Cardiff Council again.

If your child has more than 5 days of unauthorised absence since September 2022 or takes an unauthorised holiday, then you are at risk of a Fixed Penalty Notice Fine being issued.

Fines are **£60** at first, then rising to **£120** and **£180** - if the fine is still not paid then you will be summoned to court and the fine and costs will rise again. **Please note these fines do not go away.** Please make sure to read any correspondence carefully.


